Tennis is a racket sport that is played either individually against a single opponent (singles) or between two teams of two players each (doubles).

Each player uses a tennis racket that is strung with cord to strike a hollow rubber ball covered with felt over or around a net and into the opponent's court.

<p>The object of the game is to7 , É manoeuvre the ball in such a way that t
he opponent is not able to play a valid return.</p>

The opponent is not able to play a valid return ball;
<p>The player who7 , £ is unable to return the ball validly will not gain a point, while the opposite player will.[1][2]</p>
