A full house in  
poker is a solid, yet unique card hand that combines three-of-a-kind and a pair.  
Considered one of the best hands in poker, a full house is still not the best hand on  
the table. You can beat it with a four-of-a-kind and all the straight flushes, including  
a royal flush.  
One of the most&#127989; memorable full houses in poker history is the final hand  
of the 2003 WSOP Main Event. With a J,â†5,â†4,â†E flop,&#127989; Chris Moneymaker flopped two-pair  
while holding 5,â†4,â† versus Sammy Farha,Âs top pair as he held J,â†10,â†. After they went  
all-in&#127989; post-flop, the dealer turned the 8,â† and rivered the 5,â†, completing Moneymaker,Âs  
winning full house that ultimately changed poker forever.  
What&#127989; is a Full House?  
A full  
house in poker is a five-card hand containing a three-of-a-kind and a pair. It can&#127989; also  
be called ,Áa full boat,,À more commonly shortened to just ,Áa boat,.À A full house is  
considered a very&#127989; strong hand in poker and it is often a winning poker hand. Although  
this unique hand outranks many common poker&#127989; hands, a full house is not unbeatable.

House Rankings  
The full house is the third-highest hand in the standard poker hand  
rankings (fourth if you count royal flushes as a separate hand) Tj T\* □BT /F1 12 Tf 5

The full house marks a transition&#127989; between the more common hand
